New Addition to Our Church Website

We have an exciting addition to our church web page which has already become quite useful to those frequenting our site. This addition is PowerPoint Classes. So far we have two classes available to our visitors: "An Introduction to The Book of Mormon" and "Prayer." We also have a class on "Priesthood" which will soon become available and hopefully we'll continue to add more classes as time goes on. Because we have so many visitors to our web site who are new to our faith, these PowerPoint classes are designed to be very basic in nature.

For those who might not know what a Power-Point presentation is, PowerPoint is a way of showing visuals on a computer in the form of a slideshow. In our case these "visuals" are classes which teach the basics of our church's beliefs. Not only can they be viewed on a computer, but they can also go from the computer, through a projector, and shown on a large screen for a whole congregation to watch.

What's really neat about this is that a person visiting our web page can download these classes to their own computer and view them from the comfort of their own home. They proceed through the class by clicking their mouse button. They can move forward through the class or move

backwards to review material. Since these classes are downloaded to their computer, they can watch them time and time again. They can also email these classes as an attachment to friends, loved ones, or anyone else who might be interested. In this day and age of modern technology the potential is astronomical.

We have many people from all over the world who visit our page. Many of these people are new to our faith and doctrine. Our Pastor has received numerous emails from people from across the globe inquiring about our church and he has mailed out several Book of Mormons and Inspired Versions of the Bible to those who request them. So far these PowerPoint classes have been a surprising success. During the month of March, "The Book of Mormon" class was downloaded 37 times while the class on "Prayer" was downloaded 30 times. It's exciting to know that our branch is literally reaching out to the entire world through people visiting our web page. They are listening to our sermons and downloading classes which teach our basic beliefs.
