#### A Testimony about the Ladies Relief Society

For nearly 2 years my mind had intermittently found itself engaged in the consideration of a local women's group. Petitions had been made, from time to time, but an organization's value is largely predicated upon its ability to benefit those it intends to serve. I laid the matter before the Lord after having made some effort in my own mind to study out the particular nature of such a body, and the means whereby it might promulgate the mission of Christ. My mind was satisfied in the abilities of our wives, daughters, and sisters in Christ, and the need for their ministry was increasingly palpable amongst the Saints and beyond. A regional women's director office had been put in place, and effectively filled. Regional activities were well-served, but something yet lacked in terms of our local opportunity. Approximately 18 months ago, I petitioned some of the women to provide support for shut-ins, and several goodnatured ladies responded, but the effort lacked organization and faltered.

Several months passed, but my mind remained excited in this vein, and my excitation was increasingly fostered by way of inspiration and the spirit which calls upon us to serve more diligently those who stand in need.

My soul found great interest in studying the history of Christ's Church, and particularly the ministry provided by a group of dedicated sisters, led by Emma Smith, who formally organized a "Ladies Relief Society" in 1842. Their mission was to serve humanity, and the Author thereof, in a way that more perfectly reflected the countenance of Christ, in love and in humility. My thoughts ignited more dedicated prayer, and my prayers were answered when I sat down to write a letter of invitation to the women in Salem, an invitation to form a Ladies Relief Society.

Ten women met on November 16, 2008, and unanimously voted to form the LRS, accepting my letter of invitation as a general guideline for it's operation. I removed myself from the meeting, and retired to my room. As all ten women sang a closing hymn, "Send Me Forth, O Blessed Master", the Spirit of the Lord rested upon me, and a tremendous reassurance was given, that the Lord is well-pleased...that this good and ancient work once more finds itself within His gracious and eternal body. The Spirit conveyed the Lord's endorsement, and thrills my soul to this very moment. May God bless the efforts of the humble.

# The Elders of Kirtland to Their Brethren Abroad Published in *The Evening and the Morning Star*. December 1833

Dear Brethren in Christ, and companions in tribulation:

It seemeth good unto us to drop a few lines to you, giving you some instruction relative to conducting the affairs of the Kingdom of God, which has been committed unto us in these latter times by the will and testament of our Mediator, whose intercessions in our behalf are lodged in the bosom of the Eternal Father, and ere long will burst with blessings upon the heads of all the faithful.

We have been children - and are too much so at the present time; but we hope in the Lord that we may grow in grace and be prepared for all things which the bosom of futurity may disclose unto us. Time is rapidly rolling on, and the prophecies must be fulfilled. The days of tribulation are fast approaching and the time to test the fidelity of the Saints has come. Rumor with her ten thousand tongues is diffusing her uncertain sounds in almost every ear; but in these times of sore trial let the Saints be patient and see the salvation of God. Those who cannot endure persecution and stand in the day of affliction, cannot stand in the day when the Son of God shall burst the veil and appear in all the glory of His Father with the holy angels.

On the subject of ordination, a few words are necessary. In many instances there has been too much haste in this thing, and the admonition of Paul has been too slightingly passed over, which says, "Lay hands suddenly upon

no man." Some have been ordained to the ministry and have never acted in that capacity, or magnified their calling at all. Such may expect to lose their calling except they awake and magnify their office...

Let the elders be exceedingly careful about unnecessarily disturbing and harrowing up the feelings of the people. Remember that your business is to preach the Gospel in all humility and meekness, and warn sinners to repent and come to Christ. Avoid contentions and vain disputes with men of corrupt minds, who do not desire to know the truth. Remember that "it is a day of warning and not a day of many words."...If they receive not your testimony in one place, flee to another, remembering to cast no reflections nor throw out any bitter sayings. If you do your duty, it will be just as well with you as though all men embraced the Gospel.

Be careful about sending boys to preach the Gospel to the world...lest they become puffed up and fall under condemnation and into the snare of the Devil.

Finally, in these critical times be careful, call on the Lord day and night. Beware of pride. Beware of false brethren who creep in...Awake to righteousness and sin not; let your light shine and show yourselves workmen that need not be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. Apply yourselves diligently to study that your minds may be stored with all necessary information.

We remain your brethren in Christ, anxiously praying for the day of redemption to come, when iniquity shall be swept from the earth and everlasting righteousness brought in. Farewell. Caroling and a Good Cause

On December 19, 2008, twenty winter-hardy and brave souls gathered at the Herren's for an evening of caroling, apple cider, and fellowship. Though the donations have dwindled, the requests for assistance have grown. In this one small way, the Saints have again shown their willingness to provide assistance to those in need, both within the church and without. They also demonstrated the joy of Christ as they lifted up praise to Him in songs of everlasting joy. Some sang in perfect
