His life is one of extreme poverty, void of things material such as a food and clean water, but rich in faith and love. Nishan captured the hearts of our brothers and his story was shared with compassion and hope despite obvious need and depravation. Nishan lives in an area of the nation where the streets are littered with piles of garbage and scavenging animals seeking some nutrition. Nishan's current circumstances are not ideal, and by our standards, might seem somewhat desperate.

The Lambs of Zion have been collecting spare change and saving it in an effort to help Nishan in his station in life. Each Lamb has a special container with his picture on it, specifically for this cause. Recently their efforts have had help by other saints in the region and beyond. The popular "ice bucket challenge", which raised millions of dollars for ALS, was used to help raise both awareness and funds for our faithful young brother on the other side of the world. So far the total raised is nearly \$350 from the ice bucket challenge alone! What a wonderful blessing. Thank you to all who opened their hearts and accepted the challenge, braving the frigid water for a great cause. The goal in mind is to raise enough to pay for one year of Nishan's tuition in a boarding school. If he is able to pay for the boarding school, it will ensure that he receives an education, and provide the only means possible of overcoming his current circumstances. Another benefit of Nishan going to boarding school is that it would enable Nishan to move into the dormitories on the grounds of the school and out of the poor conditions he currently lives in. The tuition for one year of boarding school is \$1800 US dollars, which is far beyond the realm of reality for his family.

Thank you again to all who have helped thus far. If you feel that you would like to help Nishan, it is by no means too late. There are many opportunities on the horizon and new challenges in the works. If you feel in your heart to help, please see any Lamb of Zion and give them spare change or whatever amount you would like to donate. An envelope with Nishan's name can be given to me and will also ensure that the monies received will be set aside for his tuition.






Ladies Relief Society Yoga Night
