## **Pacific Northwest Summer Preaching Series**

#### by Brother Brian Herren

In August of 2012, Brother Travis Clark and I were able to visit Kenya, and God changed our lives forever. We were richly blessed by the generosity of the Kenyan Saints, the sincerity of their commitment to Christ, and their faithful disposition toward His loving gospel. The sacrificial nature by which they responded to God's call was a piercing reminder of the finer elements of man's potential. We left Kenya, but our hearts stayed behind. The same should be noted in regard to our more recent blessings in Nepal.

Instrumental to our reception of the kindness and privilege that only the heavens can mete out, was a family of servants so devoted to such causes that we found ourselves at home in the eastern reserves of a continent once forgotten. Brother Eric Odida, and his wife, Sister Pamela, opened their doors, and our Heavenly Father opened the heavens. Their sons, Brother Dean and Brother Prestler, along with those that share their loving home, gave us a lifetime of reason to rejoice. Since our first meeting, it has been our hope that we might one day receive Brother and Sister Odida in our homes, and make the way for their ministry to the Saints in the Pacific Northwest. By the grace of God, and the divine provision which refines our faith, Brother Eric and Sister Pamela were received in the Pacific Northwest region of the United States for the first time on July 4, 2014. They offered ministry in Salem, Oregon and Vancouver, Washington.

Elder Eric Odida preached a three day series, beginning in Vancouver and concluding in Salem. He spoke of the "miracle of love" during the first of the three sermons, and the Holy Ghost inspired the congregants in Saintly fellowship as he shared. Many refused to leave after the preaching service had concluded, preferring to continue in worship at a campfire service directed by Sister Cessaries Galusha and Brother Dustin Mason.

After spending some time appreciating the creative impress of God's matchless design in the great outdoors, hiking the Columbia River Gorge, and sampling local salmon, Brother Eric again occupied the pulpit on July 5th for an evening service. He spoke of the power which the gospel has to change the lives of men, and shared many inspiring testimonies. The Spirit directed and the preaching continued into the evening so that we were blessed with a fullness that created great expectations for the following day's services. ...continued on page 4

The Saints of the region had traveled to Vancouver for the first two sermons of the series, and on Sunday, July 6th, they traveled to Salem for the final sermon. The church building was full. Elder Gary Livingston provided special music to begin the day and we passed to our various classes. There were so many children and young folks in attendance, that special considerations had to be made. When the classes were finished, the sanctuary was again filled with Saints, old and young. Elder Brian Herren presided, with High Priests John Henderson and Bill Curtis, Elder Gary Livingston and Elder Eric Odida occupying the rostrum. After prayer and song, offerings of money and music, Brother Eric greeted the Saints in the name of the Lord and administered greetings on behalf of the Church in Kenya. If words could convey the ministry we received, I would send them forth here with special design, but they will fail to represent the spirit of the moment. The sermon spoke to the healing of the ten lepers in Luke 17, and Brother Eric asked, "Where are the nine?", "Where are you?". We have been healed of a disease worse than leprosy, whose wages are death in body and spirit, but have we turned toward the Lord as the one or gone to our daily lives as the nine?

After the final preaching service, the Saints assembled at Silver Falls State Park for a picnic. Beautiful weather and stunning water falls complimented the towering trees and green grass. The youth created a circle and began to sing songs of praise, and we spent a considerable portion of the day there. The next appointment was at 6:00 pm, when Brother Eric showed slides to about 25 Saints in one of our homes. He shared testimonies and answered questions. The young men were so excited in the gospel that it seemed their agitation would demand they begin their missions that moment. The day following was spent more leisurely, drifting along the Oregon coastline, tasting local seafood, running on the beach, wading in the cool Pacific waters, and walking barefoot through the sand. Sister Cessaries Galusha, Sister Melissa Clark, and Brother Vitaliy Surov are to be commended for their special ministry here.

The last evening of the Odida's stay was spent in supper, before prayers were offered at the cross at the church lot in Salem. May God continue to bless us in the harmony of the Sprit that has settled upon us, that His light might serve as a lighthouse to these shores until such a time as we are added to the kindled fire in the Center Place, Zion the beautiful.

One night, Brian showed us a power point of his missionary trips, and there was a certain excitement in each of us, longing for the Spirit that God gave to Brian during those trips. During campfire, we would sing songs, share testimonies, pray, and listen. The spirit of peace would be upon each of us, and as we would leave campfire, that same spirit was with us. Then we had devotions. It was a time where we would discuss camp things, share our thoughts, pray and thank God, and to encourage each other. Mostly, devotions were held in our cabins, but sometimes we would go out to another place. One night, the senior high boys had our devotions on a nearby hill that overlooked the camp ground and the surrounding areas. The night had a stillness to it, and the sky was lit up with stars. Never had I seen so many stars, and never had I beheld the beauty of stars as that night. God's Spirit was with us all, and we felt it on that hilltop. A warm breeze even came upon as in the stillness of the night, something that just gave each of us chills. Feeling God's Spirit that powerfully that night was just so amazing and overwhelming,

and that on days when I doubt, I just remember that night, that Spirit, that God, who "with billions of people in the world, God still chooses to give care to six men on a hilltop". How Great Is Our God? On another night, after devotions in our cabins, we began to prepare for bed, when we heard singing as the singing of angels. The girls had gone outside and had started to sing outside the boy's windows. They sang All In All, and I would have lied if I said that I had heard something more beautiful. Their voices were just flowing, and were so majestic, that we boys just pondered how girls could sing so beautifully. Moments like these could just summarize camp. There are so many amazing events and moments that occurred, that if everything was written down "The Earth itself couldn't contain the books thereof". From the soaring eagle that flew over the baptism, the kitchen raids by 'Kitchen Team Six', to the heart warming testimonies after campfire, God's Spirit was with all of us, giving us so much. Brian told me one day that as much as we share our testimonies, our moments, our events that happened at camp, to people who weren't present, they wouldn't be able to fully understand and fully imagine what it was like and how magnificent it was unless God revealed it to them, so though I tried to write this to give a summary of camp, only those who were present will fully feel and understand the magnitude of God's presence at NW Regional Camp 2014. Thank you all who made this camp possible, all who prayed and supported, and all who attended. Thank you for the lasting friendships you have given me, and for taking me in as one of your own into this church. Thank you God, for this church, for bringing us together, for your



And now for a man to take up his cross, is to deny himself all ungodliness, and every worldly lust, and keep my commandments." (Matt 16:25-26) Gary brought forth many wonderful scriptures concerning perfection, as we have been commanded. "Ye are therefore commanded to be perfect, even as your Father who is in heaven is perfect." (Matt 6:50) We had marvelous discussion throughout the class on perfection. Following Gary, Brother Mike Terry taught concerning being "Anxiously engaged." "Verily I say, Men should be anxiously engaged in a good cause, and do many things of their own free will, and bring to pass much righteousness; for the power is in them..." (D&C section 58d) We were admonished to spend our time in His service and become the laborers which the Lord desires us to be. Mike's class and message is one that each of us who desires to serve the Lord should heed and be attentive to continually. "A strength to His flock" was Brother Brian Herren's theme for the next class. "For he suffered them for an example, preferring one another." (John 4:4) Brian brought forth that the work of the Lord is not all on the Lord, nor all on man, but the labor is to be done together for the purpose of bringing forth His will. Brian had asked that suggestions for how we may become better laborers with God be brought forth for an evening discussion. "All are called according to the gifts of God unto them; and to the intent that all may labor together ... " (D&C 119 8b) The discussion included prayer and fasting, making ourselves available, being of good cheer, studying, stewardship, and listening. The emphasis of discussion was placed on being sensitive to the Spirit that we may be aware of other's needs. Saturday ended with an amazingly beautiful song service brought by Brother Gary Livingston. Gary gave testimony to each of the songs and the inspiration behind writing each one. How blessed we were! Our weekend together was short, wonderful, and powerful.
