
Regional T-Shirts by Brother Brian Herren

The 2017 theme for the Pacific Northwest Region is: "Make Ready a People Prepared for the Lord". We might consider this call as we prepare for the Lord spiritually and physically, and become the people He is working to develop in us. A parable found in Matthew 25 and Doctrine and Covenants 45 addresses the need to prepare as follows:

And then, at the day, before the Son of Man comes, the kingdom of heaven shall be likened unto ten virgins, who took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom. And five of them were wise, and five of them were foolish. They that were foolish took their lamps and took no oil with them; but the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps.

While the bridegroom tarried they all slumbered and slept. And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him. Then all those virgins arose, and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said unto the wise, Give us of your oil; for our lamps are gone out. But the wise answered, saying, Lest there be not enough for us and you, go ye rather to them that sell, and buy for yourselves. And while they went to buy, the bridegroom came; and they that were ready went in with him to the marriage; and the door was shut.

The regional t-shirts have been designed to reflect God's call to be prepared, with oil in our lamps, and a flame brightly burning. The artwork on the back of the shirt includes the image of an authentic Hebrew oil lamp supported by fruit bearing olive branches. If you would like a shirt, please look for them at the various retreats and reunion. Everyone who would like a shirt should feel free to take one, regardless of their ability to contribute financially. Please pick one up and wear it. When: July 30th - Aug.5th 2017 (Drop off: Sunday 3pm) (Pick up time: Saturday 12:00pm.)

Location: Lewis River Campgrounds: 18334 Ne Lucia Falls Road, Yacolt, Wa 98675

Cost: \$125 (Please make checks out to the Northwest Region of Restoration Congregations or simply NWRRC.) If you need assistance with this fee, please see your local youth leader or pastor. Checks can be mailed in advance to the regional treasurer, Brother Jim Clark, at 4577 Sunflower Way NE, Salem, Oregon, 97305

Camp is for youth between 6th - 12th (includes newly graduated seniors) grade 2017-2018.

For any questions or emergency, call Brother Dustin Mason's cell: (360) 931-1738.

We would ask that all attending this camp would come prepared to draw apart from the world and to seek to draw closer to the Lord with a desire to receive and honor His Spirit.

Please observe the following:

- Youth camp is filled with activity: Please be prepared for swimming and hiking, singing praises and worshiping God.
- Please read the rules carefully before signing the registration form. Keep this sheet for reference as you are packing
- Signed registration and medical forms are required.
- Campers are expected to participate in all activities with enthusiasm and a positive attitude. They must treat others with respect, courtesy, and kindness. • Be respectful to your counselors and be willing to pitch in and help if asked. • Be respectful of the grounds and the property of others.
- Dress code will be enforced. Dress code is as follows: no short-shorts, no short shirts (bare midriffs), tube tops, spaghetti straps, low-cut tops or see-through tops. No inappropriate language or logos on any clothing. Please dress in a modest fashion and bring a bathing suit that is modest and has good coverage. Otherwise, you may be asked to wear shorts or a shirt over the suit for swimming. If you are not sure whether an item of clothing fits the dress-code, ask a counselor for an opinion before entering the common areas wearing it.

No foul language, sexual contact, innuendos or derogatory remarks are permitted. • All participants must stay within the boundaries of the campgrounds (to be defined at orientation), through the duration of camp and must remain in areas that are supervised by camp counselors. • No CD players, cell phones, iPods, or electronic devices are allowed in camp. If

brought, they will be taken away until the end of camp. (Counselors will make their cell phones available in an emergency.) • Possession or use of weapons, tobacco products, alcohol or illegal drugs are not permitted. If probable cause exists, Camp Director will be allowed to search a person and personal property for illegal items. • No gum, candy, pop or other junk food is to be brought to camp. Refreshments will be provided. There is no need to bring money to the camp. All snacks will be provided.

All rules will be interpreted at the discretion of the Camp Director and Staff.

Dear Saints, please mark your calendars and plan to attend a summer preaching series to be held in the Pacific Northwest, June 2-4, 2017. High Priest Paul Gage, of Independence, will preach Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. All are invited for a potluck picnic after Sunday morning services at Silver Falls State Park. This will mark the 4th annual Northwest Regional Summer Preaching Series. In 2014, Brother Eric Odida preached a three day series, followed by Brother Frank Shepard in 2015 and Brother David Gilmore in 2017. This year, Brother Paul Gage will preach the series and all who attend are sure to be blessed. Brother Paul is a gifted preacher with a commanding understanding of scripture coupled with an uncompromising commitment to the fundamental tenets of the Old Jerusalem Gospel. He is a pillar of the Church, a steadfast and steady man, who carries the gifts of the fathers of our faith. As each day of ministry and fellowship builds upon the previous, those who are able to attend the entire series will be especially glad that they made the effort.

A special Sunday morning service will be held at Silver Falls State Park (June 4): near 20024 Silver Falls Hwy SE, Sublimity, OR 97385. Look for the South Falls Day Use Area. The park is about 1.5 hours from the Vancouver Branch. A shelter has been rented within the park's vast forests (9,200 acres in all - Oregon's largest state park), just a moment's walk from the towering South Falls. The facility has running water, electricity and an enormous fire place. Bathrooms are nearby and a paved path connects the picnic shelter (shelter E) to the parking lot. The offerings collected at the preaching series will be used to pay airfare and expenses. Surplus offerings will be donated to the regional missionary fund. Make checks to NWRRC. 
